I found the following interesting facts on the National Parks.org website regarding "Presidents' Day".

- Presidents Day is celebrated on the third Monday in February, thanks to the 1968 Uniform Monday Holiday Act
- It was established in 1885 in honor of President George Washington's birthday
- Washington's birthday was actually on February 22, 1732 (this would be his 285th birthday!)
- Washington's birthplace is a <u>national monument</u> and is located in Colonial Beach, VA
- 5. It is still officially called Washington's Birthday by the federal government
- 6. The government debated renaming the holiday to Presidents Day to include President Abraham Lincoln's birthday, but the proposal failed in committees

- Lincoln's birthday was actually on February 12, 1809 (this would be his 208th birthday!)
- 8. Lincoln's birthplace is a <u>national historical</u> <u>park</u> and is located in Hodgenville, Kentucky
- 9. President Ulysses S. Grant established <u>Yellowstone</u> as the first national park
- 10. President Theodore Roosevelt has the most national parks named in his honor
- 11.Lincoln is a close runnerup for that title
- 12.Roosevelt's birthplace is a <u>national historic site</u> and is located in New York City, NY
- 13.<u>Adams National Historical</u> <u>Park</u> was the birthplace of two presidents: John Adams and John Quincy Adams
- 14. The most recent presidential birthplace added to the National Park System belonged to <u>William Jefferson</u> <u>Clinton</u>
- 15. There are 35 parks named after American Presidents, and one park that celebrates four of them (but it's named after a <u>New</u> <u>York attorney</u>, Charles E. Rushmore.)

Letter from the South Dakota Department of Veteran's Affairs

Happy New Year everyone! We wish you a terrific 2017 filled with happiness and good fortune.

Brad Paisley once said, "Tomorrow is the first blank page of a 365-page book. Write a good one."

Let's ensure that our 2017 book is not left blank! Let's write a good one!

Our 2016 book was full of projects, accomplishments and stories. During 2016 we honored over 1,000 Korean War Veterans, we helped Vietnam War Veterans celebrate the tenth anniversary of the dedication of their memorial, participated in numerous welcome home and outreach events, and opened the doors to a new state-of-the-art veteran's home. We partnered with the Department of the Military to create South Dakota Joining Forces; an initiative to grow community support for veterans, service members and their families. We improved veteran's preference status, provided numerous training programs for our county

and tribal veteran's service officers, assisted incarcerated veterans, served on committees for Veterans Courts and increased the number of nursing home beds at the State Veterans Home. In addition, our staff worked closely with veterans to secure over \$170 Million in compensation and pension benefits for veterans.

Each year we set new priorities to reflect the needs of all generations of veterans. As always, we encourage veterans to contact their local County or Tribal Veterans Service Officer to determine eligibility of benefits.

How many of you buy books, gadgets, or tools, only to let them sit on the shelf - never to be used? Of course you don't! But according to our records, only 2,300 veterans in South Dakota are using their GI Bill benefits and the On-the-Job Training and Apprenticeship program. The result for those not using the benefit is that 36 months of education they have paid for is sitting on the shelf unused. That education benefit is part of what veterans earned for their service so why not collect

it and use it? Why not add a chapter to your book?

As a veteran you have shown you have the talents to get things done under difficult circumstances. Build on that by picking up the right tools and improving what you have. Veterans from Vietnam Era, Post 9/11 and Gulf War Era should give our team a call and visit with them about education benefits, free tuition and housing allowances (605-773-3269).

We truly enjoy interacting with veterans, service members, and their families throughout our great state. We have tremendous partners at federal, state, and local levels who work tirelessly to ensure great outcomes. We are all here to work with our veterans.

Let's make sure our 2017 book has numerous pages and is a best seller. Keep the book open and continue to add chapters to your journal.
