The Pledge of Allegiance was recited and Chaplain Sherry Blackwell led the invocation. Roll call showed a quorum. Council members in attendance included President Kayleen Meyers, Vice-President Marlene Kotab, Past President Gayle Funk, Treasurer-Membership Chair Edna Steinberg, Officer-at-Large Mary Williams and Chaplain Sherry Blackwell. Marlys List and Area V Director Sharon Henderson and her husband were guests.

Edna Steinberg move to deviate from the agenda. Motion carried. Marlene Kotab moved to accept the 2016 conference minutes with some spelling corrections. Motion carried.

Special guest Sharon Henderson, Area V Director and husband Ken were introduced.

The treasurer's report was tabled. Mary Williams and Gayle Funk were appointed to the audit committee. Bills were presented. These included \$17.74 to Edna Steinberg for stamps and cards, \$25.28 to Joann McElroy for copies and postage, and \$76.68 to Kayleen Meyers for copies.

# Symbols for the Folds of the Flag (Information from the American Legion website)

The **first** fold of our flag is a symbol of life.

The **second** fold is a symbol of our belief in eternal life.

The **third** fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

The **fourth** fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God, it is to Him we turn in times of peace, as well as in times of war, for His divine guidance.

The **fifth** fold is a tribute to our country, for in the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."

The **sixth** fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.

The **seventh** fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.

The **eighth** fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.

The **ninth** fold is a tribute to womanhood, for it has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that the character of the men and women who have made this country great have been molded.

The **10th** fold is a tribute to father, for he, too, has given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first born.

The **11th** fold, in the eyes of Hebrew citizens, represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies, in their eyes, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.

The **12th** fold, in the eyes of a Christian citizen, represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies, in their eyes, God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.

When the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it has the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under Gen. George Washington and the sailors and Marines who served under Capt. John Paul Jones and were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the U.S. Armed Forces, preserving for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.

The source and the date of origin of this Flag Folding Procedure is unknown, however some sources attribute it to the Gold Star Mothers of America while others to an Air Force chaplain stationed at the United States Air Force Academy. Others consider it to be an urban legend. It is provided as a patriotic service to all.
