# **Proposed By-laws Change to Membership**

In addition to SSG Carr's By-Law change proposals above, the below was identified by MSgt Derek Jaegar Situation: At the EANGUS Conference in Little Rock, it was passed that there is a new digital membership option available for the states to use. This is the "New to the Guard" digital membership, which is offered free of charge as a 1 time use only option. Initially, there was little direction on how this would work so the council elected not to pursue it as a state. After sitting in on a national membership committee meeting, hearing how the program will work, and speaking with Past President John Harris, I believe that it is a beneficial option to add to our membership to better introduce new members to the Enlisted Association.

# **Current By-law Paragraph:**

Article II Section 2 (Page 4) currently reads: Section 2: Membership in this Association shall be \$15.00 annually for E –1 through E–4, \$25.00 annually for E–5 & E–6, and \$40.00 annually for E–7 through E–9, which includes the national EANGUS (\$11.00) membership. Any National dues increase will be added to this structure as the situation at the time may dictate. The retired membership dues shall be \$5.00 per year for the Association dues plus the National Association dues in effect at that time.

# **Proposed change:**

Article II Section 2 (Page 4): Membership in this Association shall be \$15.00 annually for E-1 through E-4, \$25.00 annually for E-5 & E-6, and \$40.00 annually for E-7 through E-9, which includes the national EANGUS (\$11.00) membership. A "New to the Guard" digital membership is free of charge with a one-time use only code. Any National dues increase will be added to this structure as the situation at the time may dictate. The retired membership dues shall be \$5.00 per year for the Association dues plus the National Association dues in effect at that time.

# **SD National Guard Retirement Medal Policy Proposal**

Subject: Policy to implement a Retirement Medal after honorably serving twenty years in the South Dakota National Guard.

- 1.Purpose: Provide the Adjutant General (TAG) and South Dakota legislature with a proposal to implement a standalone retirement medal/decoration for South Dakota National Guard (SDNG) personnel who retire from the SDNG and have completed a minimum of twenty years of honorable service.
- 2. Position: When a SONG member retires, they are eligible for an existing meritorious service award based on "his or her years of service, degree of responsibility, and manner of performance." Based on this criteria a Guardsman's level of award is heavily weighted on their degree of responsibility and highest rank achieved. The SDNG currently has no individual award that is based solely on twenty years of honorable service to this state and closes out a Guardsman's career at retirement.

# 3. Key Points

- a. Guardsmen who retire after twenty years of honorable service are leaving their respective units without the proper recognition for faithful service that they deserve.
- b. Existing policy regarding retirement awards is skewed towards awarding higher ranking individuals' decorations that most Guardsmen have a low probability of achieving.
- c. Implementing this policy / program would simplify the criteria in awarding retirement awards. It would specifically highlight the closing out of twenty years of enduring service by officially recognizing and thanking SDNG retirees.

# 4. Discussion:

a. When Guardsmen retire today their level of award is determined based a "years of service, degree of responsibility, and manner of performance" and regulated by AR 600-8-22 Military Awards and applicable state

National Guard Regulations. While in theory this allows Guardsmen of any rank to be eligible for awards at almost every level of precedence, other award criteria based on regulation and other factors make Guardsmen ineligible for higher precedence of awards such as Legion of Merit and Meritorious Service Medal.

- b. There is no individual SDNG award where eligibility criteria is based solely on creditable years of service and retirement eligibility. There is also no SDNG award that visibly identifies and honors the end of a military career at retirement. To retire from the SDNG today, the normal length of creditable service to qualify is a minimum of twenty years.
- c. There are thousands of past and future Guardsmen who could be eligible for this award if it was made retroactive for current retirees. In an environment of low recruiting goals being met, the implementation of this retirement award for past and future Guardsmen would show this states

commitment to honoring our Guardsmen and officially thanking them for their service. Initial criteria for being eligible for this award would be twenty years of credible service, honorable discharge, and availability for medically discharged Soldiers based on criteria developed by the SDNG Retirement Medal working group. Since the Army Service Ribbon and the Air and Space Training Ribbon is the first medal that signifies the start of their career, the SDNG Retirement Ribbon would signify the closure of a Soldiers career. By implementing a retirement award with strict but standard requirements it would simplify and create equilibrium among Guardsmen when bringing closure to their careers.

- d. The policy proposal of the SDNG Retirement Ribbon would have to be approved by the TAG, South Dakota Legislature, and signed by the Governor before being implemented through the SDNG.
- e. Arguments Against the Position. Opposition to this award policy would be that the current recognition through different awards for Guardsmen at retirement is fair and equitable already. Guardsmen do not care what award they get at retirement so spending time and resources on a new
- award policy is a waste of time and money. The funding needed to retroactively award all existing retirees would never get approved by the South Dakota Legislature and signed by the Governor.
- 5. Rebuttals. SDNG leadership is receiving significant national attention regarding struggles in achieving recruitment numbers. The SDNG can mitigate some of that negative exposure by just as intently prioritizing and publicizing this new initiative in thanking and awarding our Guardsmen for their honorable service. The awarding of the SDNG Retirement Medal will be simplified in comparison to existing policy regarding retirement awards. The awarding of the SDNG Retirement Medal should be a dignified celebration that provides a hand off to the specific branch retirement programs signifying the nations continued remembrance to each Guardsmen devoted service.
- 6. Recommendation. Recommend to the South Dakota Enlisted Association to put a working group together who's mandate will be to find agreement on all necessary criteria to implement an SDNG Retirement Medal policy.


